**Welcome to the West Lancashire College Parent Newsletter 2024 edition, aimed to help parent/carers of young people leaving school this summer support their child with a seamless progression into post 16 education.**

We have also been lucky enough to be awarded Turing funding that has meant many of our students have attended all expenses paid for trips to Austria, Cyprus, and Vienna where students were able to carry out industry placement in international settings, as well as having a great holiday! For 24/25 we have bid for more trips through Turing to destinations including The Netherlands, Germany, Spain, Malta, and Cyprus, and are hopeful that students joining us from September will benefit from these fantastic opportunities.

I am very proud of our college and the fabulous experience we offer students at West Lancs. The quality of teaching and learning is second to none and our excellent wrap around support ensures our students have the very best opportunity to succeed, and I am positive that we can offer your child one of the very best post-16 options in the area.

# Courses to suit all learning styles

Choosing the right course for your child can seem daunting, but the main things to consider are their learning style and their career aim, if they know this.

## BTEC's

A BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma is equivalent to three A Levels A\*-C. BTECs are nationally recognised, work-related qualifications that give students the knowledge, understanding and skills that they need to progress to University, an Apprenticeship or employment.

BTECs are ideal if the student knows what career they'd like to embark on. They combine practical learning with subject theory content, so they really prepare students for their next step. At West Lancashire College, we offer BTECs in Art and Design, Computer Science, Early Years Education, Engineering, Health and Social Care, Sports and Uniformed Public Services.

## Advanced Level Courses

Advanced Level 3 courses are studied over 2 years and are broadly equivalent to A Levels. They are designed to give students the skills and education that prepare them for their vocational careers or progression to University.

Similar to BTECs, Advanced Level courses are ideal if the student knows what career they'd like to embark on. At West Lancashire College, we offer Advanced Level courses in Criminology, Psychology and Human Biology.

## Technical Courses

Technical courses are industry specific and offer training at a variety of levels. They provide knowledge and practical skills required to progress into further study, skilled employment or Apprenticeships.

We offer technical courses in Beauty Therapy, Bricklaying, Carpentry and Joinery, Electrical Installation, Hairdressing, Motor Vehicle and Plumbing.

## T Levels

T Levels are a brand-new vocational qualification, designed to provide students with all the skills needed for their future. They are a 2-year qualification, designed in collaboration with employers to bring classroom lessons and industry placement together.

At West Lancashire College, we offer 5 exciting T Levels in Business, Digital, Education and Childcare, Engineering and Health where students will spend 80% of their time in the classroom and 20% on an industry placement to ensure they develop all of the skills and experience that employers are looking for.

## Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships offer young people the opportunity to gain a nationally recognised qualification whilst gaining skills with an employer and receiving a salary. They are ideal for students who are ready to enter the world of work.

We offer Apprenticeships in Carpentry and Joinery, Electrical Installation and Engineering. Our Apprenticeship team work with employers across the region to recruit Apprentices and if we don't have a current vacancy in their chosen sector, we will support your child to find a suitable employer.

## £1m funding for campus investment

We are delighted to announce that we have recently been awarded £1m worth of funding from the Local Skills Improvement Funding (LSIF) and government T Level funding to further enhance our beautiful campus in the town centre of Skelmersdale.

We have some fantastic facilities including The School of Science, The Hair & Beauty Lounge, Advanced Construction and Engineering Centre, the Sports Performance Lab and the Electrical Centre. The additional funding has meant we are able to develop our facilities further for the benefit of our students, both current and future.

Funding in improving various teaching areas is already in place, as well as into an employability hub which will incorporate innovate meeting and delivery spaces. Alongside this, we aim to refurbish the social spaces for our students including study pods, relaxing seating areas, a modern dining experience, plus a brand-new visitor reception area.

Our Digital classrooms now boast state-of-the-art computer equipment which includes Stone Magma High Performance Workstations (Assu B660M-A) with a number of bespoke aspects for each individual computer, including fully modular quiet PSU and Windows 11 Home Advanced.

The Health Care department now has a real-life hospital ward for students to train in, complete with reception, waiting area and hospital beds. The Ward is packed with some fabulous resources including a catheterization simulator, a Seymour II wound care simulator, Hemiplegia Simulator and GERi complete nursing skills manikin.

Early Years students can now train in a mock primary school setting, a specialist practical classroom that contains children's furniture and a wide range of children's teaching aids that will support and inspire our students thinking, as well as virtual babies that offer students that chance to experience what caring for a baby really entails.



# Fully funded international trips for West Lancs students!

This year, we are delighted to have been able to secure government funding through Turing for educational international trips to some fantastic destinations.

Turing is the UK's global programme to study and work abroad whose objectives are levelling up across the UK, to develop student skills and also provide value for UK tax payers. The funding has enabled us to offer the trips all expenses paid, which is a fantastic opportunity for our students.

Our Health and Social Care students visited Malta in April and carried out their industry placement in an international hospital and care settings. Digital Technologies, Construction, Engineering and Motor Vehicle students visited Austria just after Easter and undertook industry placement in some of the leading car manufacturers, construction and digital companies in Vienna. In June, Education and Early Years students will be attending Cyprus where they will work in an international school.

# How can I support my child?

As a parent, you know that this is a crucial time for your child as they decide on their next step. Below, you will find out frequently asked questions that we hope will help you to support them in their decision on their post-16 education.

## College or Sixth Form – which is best?

The choice of this depends on the individual student. As a college, we offer T Levels, BTECs, and Vocational courses which will lead into further study at University, employment or an Apprenticeship in a more adult-set environment. We also offer technical courses where students can learn a trade or skill. Our programmes of study aim to provide skills which promote independence, build resilience and allow students to progress onto their next step, whatever that may be.

## When should my child apply to college?

Your child can apply to study at West Lancashire College whilst they are in Year 11 and as soon as they feel confidence with their preferred course choice. We would advise that they send in their application as soon as possible, as they will then have the best chance of securing a place.

## How does my child apply?

Completing the application is easy and can be completed on any mobile device, laptop, computer or iPad.

- Search for your child's chosen course and complete the online application
- You will receive confirmation of the application in an email
- Our Admissions Team will shortly be in touch to talk through the application and to inform them of what happens next. We will keep in touch throughout the year with lots of useful information about college life

## What should I do if my child does not know which course to choose?

We advise anyone who is unsure to visit our Open Events to receive a taster of our courses. ## What will it cost for my child to study at West Lancashire College?

If your child is under 19 on the 31st of August in the year that their course starts, the course tuition is free. Some courses do have associated costs with uniform and/or kit, but this will be discussed at the interview. Financial support is available for those who need it.

## Is financial support available?

Information on transport, bursaries and help with uniform and kit costs will be discussed at the interview. We offer a free college coach service and have a superb financial support package for our younger students.

## Is there information for parents of students who have already applied?

Once your child has applied to study with us, they will be invited to attend an interview where they will receive more information about the college, as well as be given the opportunity to talk with the subject tutors, ask questions and receive specialist guidance on all courses.

## My child has accepted a conditional offer but has changed their mind about which subject(s) they would like to study. What will happen next?

Applications who change their chosen subject may need a further interview to establish if the course is suitable to them.

When does my child start at West Lancashire College? All applicants with an offer of a place will be written to in August with a date and time to enrol.
